#### **Prayer Corner**

Let us pray for our First Holy Communion children, that making their First Reconciliation this weekend will help them to draw closer to Christ in hope and joy.

#### Fr Mark writes:

How often do we moan about things in our community, our parish, our world? Yet, how often do we actually do something to improve the situation?

This week, we're looking at another principle of Catholic Social Teaching, the Call to Community and Participation. Pope Francis' encyclical On Fraternity and Social Friendship focuses on the need to think of ourselves not only as individuals but as one human family. Society has often focused on freedom and equality, whilst neglecting fraternity. In *Let Us Dream*, Pope Francis says that "Fraternity will enable freedom and equality to take its rightful place in the symphony.'

We are called to be active members of society, he says. The changes in society that we need don't "depend on some unseen mechanism, a future in which humanity is a passive spectator. No: we're protagonists".

Each of us is called to look at the reality of the world in which we live. To pay attention to what is happening. To see how our sisters and brothers are being treated, and how we ourselves are treating others. Reflecting on this, we're called to action; to be a positive presence in our communities. This is how we will put love into action, living out Caritas.

What are my gifts and talents which could be used to the advantage of the wider community?

Community is, in itself, an important concept we need to nurture. We are social beings, who flourish from our relationship with others. Building community, within our parishes and where we live and work, is also important. How might we contribute to these communities?

Pope Francis has warned that we can hide behind virtual communities. Although social media can help us develop community in some ways, it can also hinder our involvement. We need to be able to meet with others to develop more fully as human beings.

As far as we're able, it is our call to help build a better world and be active members of society in order to achieve this. Although it is often easy to find ourselves bemoaning the state of the country, our community, what's happening within our parish, we're called not to simply complain, but to get involved, contribute, and make a positive difference; to be Caritas: love in action.

Elsewhere, Pope Francis says, "A better world can be built also as a result of your efforts, your desire to change and your generosity. Do not be afraid to listen to the Spirit who proposes bold choices; do not delay when your conscience asks you to take risks in following the Master.

The Gospel tells us constantly to run the risk of a face-to-face encounter with others, with their physical presence which challenges us, with their pain and their pleas, with their joy which infects us in our close and continuous interaction. True faith in the incarnate Son of God is inseparable from self-giving, from membership in the community, from service, from reconciliation with others. The Son of God, by becoming flesh, summoned us to the revolution of tenderness.

In the First Reading which most of us will hear this weekend [not at the 10:30am Mass, where the readings will be from "Year A" and John's Gospel], we hear of Moses encountering the Lord God. The Lord reveals his name to Moses and also that he has seen the affliction of his people and heard their cry. There is a section which is edited out of what we will hear:

"Behold, the cry of the people of Israel has come to me, and I have also seen the oppression with which the Egyptians oppress them. Come, I will send you to Pharaoh that you may bring my people, the children of Israel, out of Egypt." But Moses said to God, "Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh and bring the children of Israel out of Egypt?" He said, "But I will be with you, and this shall be the sign for you, that I have sent you: when you have brought the people out of Egypt, you shall serve God on this mountain."

Moses can no longer be a bystander; he can no longer hide. The Lord has chosen Moses to lead his suffering people to freedom. The Lord God has seen the 'problem' and He is sending Moses as the 'solution'. When Moses, rightly, asks, "Who am I?", the Lord simply replies, "But I will be with you".

Are there situations where the Lord has seen his people suffering loneliness, abuse, addiction, violence, discrimination, etc. – and is sending you to be an instrument of His healing, mercy and liberation? Are there situations where you know the Lord is asking **you** to stop being a bystander and show His compassion but you're a little afraid or overwhelmed? Are there situations where the Lord is saying to you, "Don't worry; I'll be with you"? Will **you** trust Him and step forward in love?

#### **Building Works Update - 21st March 2025**

Steady progress is being made to the current phase of works, and we are told by the Contractors that they are confident that they will complete the planned works in advance of Holy Week.

When you enter the Church this coming weekend, what might you notice:

- Scaffolding into the Pastoral Centre has been removed.
- There might be the lingering smell of fresh paint; yes, work has started on painting the higher levels whilst we still have the scaffolding in place, regrettably this is not visible as it is behind the scaffolding in the Narthex and above the Sanctuary.

#### Beautifying St Peter's - 14th to 16th April 2025 - Your Help Please!

The current phase of the building works (Dirty Works) including the removal of all the scaffolding should all be completed by Friday 11 April, just in time for the celebration of Holy Week.

We are currently planning what needs to be done in advance of the Holy Week services taking place, and it is here that **we really do need your help and support**. As a parish we have wonderful teams of cleaners across all our Churches, but we feel the needs of St Peter's currently are such that we need the existing team of cleaners plus many more to help get the church ready.

Can you please give some thought as to how you might be able to help us? We are currently looking to clean the Church and the Sacristy to the best of our ability on Monday afternoon; then on Tuesday to Wax the floor; and on Wednesday to Buff (Polish) the floor.

On the Monday afternoon (14th April), we are looking for volunteers to help us clean every surface in the Church, as we all know that dust gets everywhere! We hope that with an army of volunteers we can get this done in the afternoon. Failing this, the Church might not be as clean as you might have expected it to be.

On Tuesday (15th April) we are looking for around 6 abled-bodied volunteers to help move the Seats (Benches) around to allow the floor to be waxed, please note that the floor will be slippery, it has been suggested the sturdier you are the better.

On Wednesday (16th April) we will be buffing (polishing) the floor, again if there is anyone who has any experience in using these types of machines we would welcome your assistance.
