Solidarity, Peace and Hoping that God will Do a New Thing

Father Mark writes:

This week, we will be taking time to reflect on the Catholic Social Teaching Principles of Solidarity and Peace.

The word 'solidarity' is used a lot but may not always be easy to comprehend. In Pope St John Paul II's letter, 'On the social concern of the Church', he states, '[Solidarity] is not a feeling of vague compassion or shallow distress at the misfortunes of so many people, both near and far. On the contrary it is a firm and persevering determination to commit oneself to the common good; that is to say, to the good of all and of each individual because we are all really responsible for all."

Again, the principle of human dignity our shared family made in God's image and likeness - calls us to not just feel sorry for others when we open our eyes and see the needs of the world, but to commit to action. We all have a responsibility to one another.

"In today's world, the sense of belonging to a single human family is fading, and the dream of working together for justice and peace seems an outdated utopia. What reigns instead is a cool, comfortable and globalized indifference, born of deep disillusionment concealed behind a deceptive illusion: thinking that we are all-powerful, while failing to realize that we are all in the same boat." (Pope Francis, On Fraternity and Social Friendship).

"We are all in the same boat" - all of us. Wherever we are. Whatever our age. Whatever our circumstances. We are all responsible for one another, those close by, and those far away. All of our actions have consequences locally and globally. From how we treat people we meet in the street, to the coffee we buy in the supermarket. It is how we live out Caritas, love in action.

"When I speak of solidarity, I mean much more than the promotion of philanthropic works or financial assistance to help those who lose out. Because solidarity is not the sharing of crumbs from the table, but to make space at the table for everyone." (Pope Francis, Let Us Dream).

Flowing from solidarity is the promotion of peace. In the Beatitudes we're told, "Blessed are the peacemakers". But how can we be peacemakers? If we are to live in solidarity with one another we must want the peace of all. Pope Francis warns us that "until exclusion and inequality in

between peoples are reversed, it will be impossible to eliminate violence" (The Joy of the Gospel, 59). Indeed, it is individualism, the opposite of solidarity, which is the cause of so much violence (see The Joy of the Gospel, 99).

Peace is not just the absence of conflict. It is the way we treat one another. It is the respect we afford to our fellow human beings. It is enabling all people to flourish and live their lives to the full. It is being open to true dialogue with our neighbours, whatever their beliefs, however different they may seem to us. It is using the eyes of love to see our neighbour and putting love into action.

In what ways do we need to seek peace in our own lives, our families, our community? How do we build a community in solidarity with one another? How do we become peacemakers?

"There is also a need for peacemakers, men and women prepared to work boldly and creatively to initiate processes of healing and renewed encounter." (Pope Francis, On Fraternity and Social Friendship).

Our Gospel this weekend has Jesus being presented with a woman caught in the act of adultery (I won't be the first to point out that there were presumably two people caught in this act!). According to Mosaic Law, she should have been stoned to death. Jesus's interrogators wanted to know, as they tried to trap him, what did Jesus think about this?

After a brief pause, whilst he spent time writing on the ground with his finger, Jesus says, "Let him who is without sin among you be the first to throw a stone at her One by one, they left, beginning with the oldest, until Jesus is able to say to the woman, "Neither do I condemn you; go, and from now on sin no more.

I would say that Jesus here acted in solidarity with the woman, not offering a "feeling of vague compassion or shallow distress" but rather "a firm and persevering determination to commit [himself]...to the good of all and of each individual". I would say that Jesus here sought peace, not just an absence of conflict or violence but enabling this woman to flourish. As she was dragged out of bed, her fate probably seemed to have been sealed, her hopes must have drained away...until she encountered Jesus, acting in solidarity with her, seeking peace, and "doing a new thing".

Will you let Jesus do a "new thing" in, to and through you this week as you seek to enter into deeper solidarity with your neighbour and look for the peace which only Jesus can give?

Building Works Update - 4th April 2025

Doesn't time just fly, I can't believe that this is going to be my last update for the time being relating to the Building Works in St Peter's at least for Phase I!

When you come along to St Peter's this weekend, the scaffolding has all gone, and we are getting ready for the final rush to have everything ready in the Church to help us celebrate Palm Sunday and Holy Week back in St Peter's Church. Once again, we would like to thank you for your continued patience and support over the last number of weeks, and hope that you will acknowledge that the Church is starting to look a little lighter and brighter as we start to move forward into Holy Week and the Easter Season, before we come back for the next phase.

The work this week has been in the Sacristy and on the Bell Tower Roof which is largely invisible to the majority.

We are extremely delignted with the works that have been carried out to date, and special thanks to the Contractors for enabling us to have access to Church at the weekends throughout.

I will return sometime later with more updates as to the next stage, but for now have a wonderful Holy Week and Easter Season when it arrives.

Beautifying St Peter's - 14th to 16th April 2025 - Your Help Please!

The current phase of the building works (Dirty Works) including the removal of all the scaffolding should all be completed by Friday 11 April, just in time for the celebration of Holy Week.

We are currently planning what needs to be done in advance of the Holy Week services taking place, and it is here that **we really do need your help and support**. As a parish we have wonderful teams of cleaners across all our Churches, but we feel the needs of St Peter's currently are such that we need the existing team of cleaners plus many more to help get the church ready.

Can you please give some thought as to how you might be able to help us? We are currently looking to clean the Church and the Sacristy to the best of our ability on Monday afternoon; then on Tuesday to Wax the floor; and on Wednesday to Buff (Polish) the floor.

On the Monday afternoon (14th April), we are looking for volunteers to help us clean every surface in the Church, as we all know that dust gets everywhere! We hope that with an army of volunteers we can get this done in the afternoon. Failing this, the Church might not be as clean as you might have expected it to be.

On Tuesday (15th April) we are looking for around 6 abled-bodied volunteers to help move the Seats (Benches) around to allow the floor to be waxed, please note that the floor will be slippery, it has been suggested the sturdier you are the better.

On Wednesday (16th April) we will be buffing (polishing) the floor, again if there is anyone who has any experience in using these types of machines we would welcome your assistance.

Please could you consider giving some time to help?

The White House - (St Peter's)

Dear friends,

As you know, for some years now a small working party has been working on what should be done with the White House.

We do not need the building for our Parish mission and **the building is in need of structural repairs running to hundreds of thousands of pounds**. The working party has consulted with surveyors, estate managers and architects and conducted a significant piece of work assessing multiple options for the building. The working party has also sought input from the diocese and from Parish leadership groups. **The conclusion of all this work is that the Parish should seek to sell the building**

The conclusion of all this work is that the Parish should seek to sell the building on the open market. We have taken legal advice on how this could be done to protect the interests of the Parish when the building is sold and are now in a position to appoint agents to start marketing the property.

We are aware that the building will have important memories for parishioners, including playing a role as home to the Sisters, and as a much-loved nursery, and so this has not been an easy conclusion to reach.

We will be letting the broader parish community know about our plans starting next weekend but, given your previous interest and input to our deliberations, I wanted to let you know in advance. As this is a significant change to our buildings, we are creating an opportunity for Parishioners to learn more about the studies that have been carried out and to ask questions about the proposals. I will be available in the Parish Centre after 10:30 Mass on Sunday 6th April. We will also be available via a Zoom meeting on Tuesday 8th April at Zoom (please register here if you would like to
