Stepping Forward in Love this Lent – The Care of Creation

Fr Mark writes:

"The ecological crisis shows the urgency of a solidarity which embraces time and space ... A greater sense of intergenerational solidarity is urgently needed. Future generations cannot be saddled with the cost of our use of common environmental resources." (Pope Benedict XVI, World Peace Day 2010)

The Earth and all it contains has been created by God. It is a gift, given to all for the good of all. The resources of the earth are not infinite. They have been given to us and to future generations. How we have treated and continue to treat the Earth has a profound impact on people now and in the future. Too often we have destroyed elements of the earth for a quick gain. As Pope Francis says,

"The earth, our home, is beginning to look more and more like an immense pile of filth."

As stewards, or custodians, of creation we have a special role to play. How we care for the earth is another sign of how we are Christians, how we show God's love in the world.

We are called to renew our commitment to the planet, how we treat it as individuals, and how we hold to account the way in which governments and industries treat the world whilst producing our energy and the goods we consume. Our care for creation is another way in which we show our love in action.

The Bishops of England and Wales remind us of the link between human dignity and care for the Earth in their document, *The Call of Creation*:

"The full human development of every human person both now and in future generations cannot be separated from the fate of the Earth."

It is not simply a matter of treating the Earth properly, but it is also part of our treatment of our sisters and brothers across the globe. Indeed, it is those living in the poorest communities

around the world who already feel the devastating effects of, and will be less able to adapt to, a changing climate. It is an issue which can feel overwhelming, but as we're reminded:

*"Individual actions may seem insignificant but together the **small steps of many people can have an astonishing impact.**"* (Catholic Bishops of England and Wales, The Call of Creation)

This phrase is important to hold onto as we come to the end of the six-week focus on how we can be a Caritas people, and as we commit ourselves to ways in which we will concretely step forward in love, inspired by our faith, filled with hope. Each of our actions, our small steps forward, especially when joined to the loving actions, the small steps, of others, can have "an astonishing impact".

Holy Week & Easter

We are entering into the holiest and most beautiful week of the Church year, as we accompany Christ on his final steps towards the shameful death on the Cross and beyond to the joys of the Resurrection. It is a journey from chaos and darkness to beauty and light. Our First Reading at the Easter Vigil is from the very beginning of the Bible. As Pope Francis reminds us:

"The creation accounts in the book of Genesis contain, in their own symbolic and narrative language, profound teachings about human existence and its historical reality. They suggest that human life is grounded in three fundamental and closely intertwined relationships: with God, with our neighbour and with the earth itself. According to the Bible, these three vital relationships have been broken, both outwardly and within us. This rupture is sin." (Pope Francis, Care for the Common Home, 68)

It is that sin which Jesus Christ conquers. Let us follow him faithfully, for by his dying he destroys our death and by his rising he restores our life.

This Holy Week and Easter, let us even more intentionally:

- **Be with Jesus** and
- **Become like Jesus**, so that we can, filled with hope and joy this Easter
- **Do the things that Jesus did.**

Once again, thank you so much for your patience and understanding, and we sincerely hope that the next phases of building works and restoration will be significantly less disruptive.
