FATHER MARK WRITES: KNOWING WHAT WE'RE DOING AND WHERE WE'RE GOING GIVES US HOPE

There's a story told of a family who, when their children were younger, had an au pair. One time the children were having a big row in an upstairs bedroom. The au pair ran upstairs, and what she meant to say is: 'What on earth are you doing?' but she hadn't quite mastered all the English idioms. So, what she actually said is: 'What are you doing on earth?'

Now, it's not what she thought she was saying but actually that's a great question to ask! What are you doing on earth?

In other words, 'Where have I come from? Where am I heading? Who am I? What's the point of my life? Is there any real meaning and purpose to life? Where am I heading?' These are what you might call like the first-order questions of life.

If we don't know what we're doing, or if we don't know where we're going, then life can seem particularly hopeless. We need a reliable guide, someone who can reveal to us our destination and then help us to do what we need to get there.

Jesus Reveals Heaven as Our Destination

Our readings this weekend speak into this. Our second reading picks up where last Sunday's left off – describing the heavenly Jerusalem as a breathtakingly beautiful city, with people gathered around the Lord God Himself, with Jesus the Lamb alongside Him. This is our destination. This is where we're heading: to that beautiful city where all pain is removed and all our deepest desires are fulfilled in Him. When we get there, we won't need torches or lights to see clearly because "the glory of God" gives the city light and "the lamp is the Lamb".

This knowledge that heaven is our final destination can help us when we're feeling lost or hopeless, or in the dark, or alone. If we can keep heaven as our goal then it can help us to resist and ignore the voices of those sirens who would lead us astray, down paths of ruin and destruction.

The Holy Spirit as Our Guide

Then our Gospel speaks of the promise of Jesus to give us a guide, so we can know what to do and which path to follow.

"The Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you."

We can ask the Holy Spirit to guide us and lead us and teach us. What does God want me to do? Most of us want to do what He wants us to do but we don't always know how. The Holy Spirit can help us.

Assuming that we're discerning between two things that are good (so, for example, "robbing a bank" isn't one of the options), we ask the Holy Spirit to lead us to the Lord's will, and to help us to be patient. It's not a magic trick or ChatGPT but rather a process based on a relationship, and the Lord will reveal to us what He wants to reveal in His own timing (even, especially if that wouldn't be our own timing). It's important that we give our hearts to the Holy Spirit, that we surrender control of our hearts, so we can then become aware of and attentive to, what He is doing within our hearts.

The Holy Spirit is also at work in the lives of others whom we trust and who are themselves open to the Holy Spirit in their walk with the Lord. They can sometimes see things in us that we cannot see ourselves.

We ask the Holy Spirit to bring peace and clarity. One simple way of doing this, for example, when discerning between A or B, is to say to the Lord, "Lord, I'm going to do A. I think you're calling me to do this" and then see how this decision leaves us feeling. Do we find peace or do we find our hearts unsettled, anxieties, etc.? Maybe do this for one week and then for the next week, say, "Lord, I'm going to do B. I think you're calling me to do this". Then we go with whichever one seems to be bringing more peace. And then we pray for more peace, a peace which the world cannot give, beyond all understanding. Then we make a first step forward, with the Lord a lamp to our feet, just illuminating the next step or two...

"Lord, we want to be faithful to you and what you are doing in our life. We ask that you would come with your Holy Spirit. Lord, we believe that you have a will for us, that you have a desire for our life and we want to be faithful to that. Move in our hearts so that we may know what you are asking of us. Let us know a peace, a peace that comes with being faithful to you, a peace that comes with moving in your grace, walking where you want us to walk, following where you lead. Come, Lord, with your grace and your peace. Holy Spirit, lead me; Holy Spirit, guide me."
