FATHER MARK WRITES: PREPARING A PLACE FOR EVERYONE - CENTENARY CELEBRATIONS 2026

On 14th July 1926, Cardinal Bourne, the then Archbishop of Westminster, celebrated Mass in what is now the Milner Hall. This chapel was the first Catholic Church to be consecrated post-reformation. Previously, Catholic celebrations of Mass in and around Winchester were often held in secret. Although the chapel had to be built away from the main road and public view, its very existence marked a huge step forward for the local Catholic community. Now, more than 125 years after Milner Hall's construction, a new church had been prepared for the Winchester Catholic community. As one era came to an end, another was about to begin.

On the following day, the Feast of St Swithun, 1926, Cardinal Bourne preached at another Mass, this one being celebrated by the Bishop of Portsmouth, and the first in the newly constructed St. Peter's Church. Priests from across the diocese and many representatives of civic society were present as the Catholic community took a further step out into public view

For the last 99 year's, St. Peter's has been home to countless baptisms, weddings and funerals; first holy communions, confirmations and Sunday and weekday Masses. It has been a place where candles have been lit, prayers offered, and tears shed, for joy and with sorrow. At times the church has been full to the brim, at others it has been empty save a solitary sole offering a glance or plea heavenward. People have come and gone, each leaving their own unique mark.

A Place for Everyone

If you are reading this, then there is a place in St. Peter's for you. Maybe you come here regularly to worship; maybe you've never stepped through the doors. Maybe you've been here all your life; maybe you've only just arrived.
