FATHER MARK WRITES: FROM PRIDE AND FEAR TO HUMILITY AND FAITH

A young man entered the coach of a train in a small university town in France. The ink was scarcely dry on his newly acquired diploma. As the train sped off for Paris, he took his seat in the rear of the coach near an elderly gentleman who seemed to be dozing.

As the train suddenly lurched, a string of rosary beads fell from his hand. The young man picked up the rosary and handed it to the elderly gentleman with the remark,

"I presume you are praying, sir?"

"You are right. I was praying."

"I am surprised," said the young fellow, "that in this day and age there is someone who is still so benighted and superstitious. Our professors at the university do not believe in such things," and he proceeded to "enlighten" his elderly fellow-passenger. The old man expressed surprise and amazement. "Yes," continued the young man, "today enlightened people don't believe in such nonsense."

"You don't say!" replied the old man. "Yes, sir, and if you wish, I can send you some illuminating books."
"Very well," said the old man, preparing to leave as the train came to a stop. "You may send them to this address." He handed the young man a card, which read: Louis Pasteur, Director of the Institute of Scientific Research, Paris.

It was only recently that someone pointed out to me the relationship between pride and fear. They are often two sides of the same coin. I use pride to cover up my fear and insecurities. It might lead me to being more reliant on myself than on God, or to try and control things and people. On the other hand, when I suffer from fear or anxiety it can also be a sign of an underlying issue with pride.

The path to freedom is through humility and faith. Our Scripture readings this weekend remind us of our need to be humble before the Lord and in our dealings with one another.

"The greater you are, the more you must humble yourself; so that you will find favour in the sight of the Lord." (Sirach 3:18)

Louis Pasteur, for example, in the story above, was not insecure about who he was or what he could do. He had nothing to prove and so was able to respond to the young man with great humility. He wasn't ashamed of his faith or how that might make him look.

St. (Mother) Theresa of Calcutta is someone who gives us a beautiful illustration of these two qualities. Here is a portion of one of Mother Teresa's exhortations to her novices:

"If I try to make myself as small as I can, I'll never become humble. It is humility with a hook. True humility is truth. Humility comes when I stand as tall as I can, and look at all of my strengths, and the reality about me, but put myself alongside Jesus Christ. And it's there, when I humble myself before Him, and realize the truth of who he is, when I accept God's estimate of myself, stop being fooled about myself and impressed with myself, that I begin to learn humility. The higher I am in grace, the lower I should be in my own estimation because I am comparing myself with the Lord God."

COVENANT WITH THE POOR

This weekend's Second Collection - Covenant With the Poor Appeal: Urgent Repairs in DR Congo: Our CWP appeal this weekend is to support the work of St Joseph's African Aid, a small charity focused on education and poverty relief, founded by members of the Congregation of Josephites, a Catholic teaching congregation. Our appeal is to raise funds to fix two deteriorated classroom ceilings and install ceilings in three classrooms that lack them, at St Jacques and Marie La Berceuse School, Ilebo, which was built by the Josephite Fathers in the Kasai, a remote and impoverished area of DR Congo. Students at the school recently narrowly avoided injury when parts of a classroom ceiling collapsed. The school urgently needs £3,000 to carry out the work - without which part of the school may close. Any surplus funds raised will support similar schools in Kinshasa and Kinkole.

During the Season of Creation, we join our sisters and brothers in the ecumenical family in prayer and action for our common home.

In a recent Mass for Creation, Pope Leo XIV lamented that the many natural disasters that afflict people around the world are "often caused, at least in part, by human excess and our way of life." "We must pray for the conversion of many people, both inside and outside the Church, who still do not recognise the urgency of caring for our common home."

Now is the time to think ahead and prepare to celebrate the Season of Creation, we would like to offer you the following resources:

- On CAFOD's website they have a variety of prayer resources to pray for the care of the earth, our common home.
- These prayers inspire you to give thanks for God's gift of creation, all people and creatures, to lament the climate crisis that we are facing, and to renew your commitment to care for the earth and stand in solidarity with our brothers and sisters throughout the world. i្សំរ៉ូរ៉ូរ៉ូស្កុំរ៉ូ Parish Centenary Pilgrimage Plans 2026 រ៉ូស្កុំរ៉ូរ៉ូង៉ូស៊ី

As part of the Parish Centenary celebrations, planning is underway to offer 3 parish Pilgrimages, led by Father Mark, during the Centenary Year. We would like as many people as possible to take part.

1. Camino de Santiago- Ingles route.

Walking the English route from Ferrol to Santiago de Compostela – 119KM/75 miles. This will be a 7/8 day trip departing on **Monday 8th June 2026** and returning either Sunday 14th or Monday 15th.

Day 1 Air travel to Santiago De Compostela from London, transfers to Ferroll. Day 2-6 walking the Camino Ingles, distances per day vary between 17- 30Km - (11-18 miles). The walking is of moderate intensity but a good level of walking fitness will be required to walk these distances every day for 5 days. Accommodation is B&B and dinner in 2/3 star hotels with bag transfer included.

Day 7 – Free day in Santiago de Compestela. Day 8 travel back to London/ Winchester.

Final costs will depend on numbers but anticipated at around £1,100 to include flights, transfers, accommodation in a twin room, breakfast and dinner, bag transfers.

2. Parish pilgrimage to the Catholic National Shrine & Basilica of our Lady of Walsingham, Norfolk (<u>Catholic National Shrine & Basilica of Our Lady, Walsingham</u>)

This 2 day trip will depart early on Monday 10th August and return late on the 11th August.

Day 1 We plan to travel by coach early on Monday morning to Holkham Hall & Estate Holkham Hall & Estate | Norfolk, England (arriving mid morning) with the rest of the day to enjoy this fabulous Palladian mansion, gardens and parkland. Late afternoon we will travel on the short distance to Walsingham and our accommodation at Elmham House – the Shrine's Pilgrim Hotel, for Mass and supper and a stroll around Walsingham Village and environs.

Day 2 For those able to we will walk the Holy Mile – the last mile of the Pilgrim Way to the site of the Shrine of Our Lady, (coach transfer also available). During the day there will be the opportunity to take part in the daily schedule of worship which includes Sacrament of Reconciliation, The Rosary, Stations of the Cross, Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Pilgrim's Mass. We will depart late afternoon for the return journey, stopping en route for a meal before arriving in Winchester circa 9pm.

Cost – depending on numbers for transport from Winchester, accommodation, meals (excluding lunch on day 1 and dinner day 2), entry to Holkham Hall and Gardens circa £200.

3. Pilgrimage to Rome & Assisi October 2026

An 8 day visit taking in various locations in Rome, including Mass in St Peter's, a papal audience, and tour of St Peter's. Focus will be on Christian Rome but with opportunities to explore classical Rome. Likely to spend 3/4 days in Rome and 2 full days in Assisi with visits to other sites en route.

Package will include transport from Winchester to London airports, flights accommodation and meals, entry to various locations throughout, transport and a guide. Full itinerary to be confirmed and dates of travel in October 2026 to be agreed once an idea of numbers of interested people is understood.

Indicative costs at this early stage are awaited but likely to be circa £1,500 per person.
