FATHER MARK WRITES: OBSTACLES TO EMBRACING THE LOVE OF JESUS

Jesus loves us with an unquenchable love and desires us simply to let Him love us. Let's briefly consider four obstacles that can prevent us from fully embracing His love - not to feel discouraged, but to identify what holds us back from God.

1. Lukewarmness in Our Spiritual Life

Often, worldly distractions blur our vision of God's burning love. Blessed Alvaro wrote, "the will of the lukewarm person finds its capacity to see the goodness blurred while it is on the lookout for anything that flatters its own ego." We may think that avoiding mortal sin is enough, but saints remind us that even venial sins, if unchecked, can harm our souls.

Lukewarmness is not a sudden death - it's a slow, creeping disease, death in slow motion. Consider the pain of loving parents who sacrifice everything for their children, only to be met with indifference. How much more must it hurt the heart of our Redeemer, who loves us unconditionally, when we allow spiritual lukewarmness to cloud our vision of His love? It obstructs us from placing our human love into the furnace of His heart, where it can be purified and rekindled.

2. Self-Love

Self-love is different from love of self. Jesus teaches us to love our neighbour as ourselves, which implies that loving ourselves is good - if we see ourselves through God's eyes. But self-love means seeing everything through our own lenses. Love of self is about God's view of us; self-love is about our own view of everything. In The Devotion to the Sacred Heart, Father Croiset writes:

"It is only too true that people who are not influenced in their actions by self love are very rare... If people wish to take the trouble to examine the true motives of most of their actions... they would discover that self love is the most powerful motive, that it puts on a hundred disguises and prevents the fruit of their actions."

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Self-love isn't inherently evil, but it becomes an obstacle when it leads to excessive attachment to our opinions, desires and comfort. If we're honest, we may wish the road to holiness didn't involve trials or sacrifices, but we must ask God to remove this wish so we can love Him and others more fully.

3. Pride

Pride affects our relationship with God and others. It's one of the most dangerous vices because it replaces God as the object of our love with ourselves. Pride shifts our focus from God's loving gaze to the opinions of others. Fr. Croiset warns:

"There is no greater obstacle to perfection than the spirit of pride and vanity by which most people are dominated... Even our victories are weapons which the devil makes use of against us, profiting by them to inspire us with pride."

Pride makes us crave popularity and esteem, often under the guise of honesty and charity. We try to please both God and man, but in doing so, we often fail to please either. This is the irony of pride - it not only keeps us from loving God well but also prevents us from satisfying our own misplaced desire for approval. We are made for Heaven, not for earthly praise. When we exhaust ourselves trying to impress others, we leave little love for our Saviour.

The love of Jesus cannot coexist with pride. He doesn't want us to toil for fruit that doesn't satisfy. Only when we offer our hearts to Jesus will we find the dignity and approval we long for. When united with His meek and humble Heart, we will find rest.

4. Unresolved Vices

The final obstacle is unresolved vices. Father Croiset explains:

"The fourth obstacle to the devotion... to the Sacred Heart, are certain unmortified passions... many people make war on all their passions, but somehow there is one predominate one which they spare... A small leak will sink a great ship, a single spark will cause a great fire; a single defect is sufficient to spoil an otherwise beautiful painting... These are great obstacles to the pure love of Jesus Christ and to the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus."

Even those who strive for holiness may spare one vice that aligns with their inclinations. This one unmortified passion can hinder their spiritual progress. We may be surprised by people who have practiced piety for years yet still harbour imperfections they condemn in others but won't correct in themselves.

This obstacle, like the others, comes down to trust. Do we trust Jesus enough to surrender everything - our worries, comfort, and attachments - to Him? Or is there something we're still holding back?

Often, we give Jesus much - but not everything. And what we withhold, however small, can prevent us from reaching the holiness He desires for us and that we truly long for. We need Jesus' help to place all our passions into the furnace of His Heart, where they can be purified for His glory and our good. Only then will our hearts become like His.

This week we will be welcoming Fr Pedro Jose Hernandez O'Hagan to our parish as our new assistant priest (we are blessed that he's able to arrive even before Fr Benedict has moved to Guernsey, so there'll be a short overlap). Here you can read a short biography to give you a flavour of who he is. He arrives Mon 18th so please do give him an enormous welcome when you see him.

Fr. Pedro José Hernández O'Hagan was born in Mexico City in 1981. His dad is also from Mexico City and his mum is from London. He grew up in Mexico City and, during his childhood, he would travel once a year to England to visit his mum's side of the family. He worked as an English teacher in Mexico for a few months before entering the seminary in the year 2000. He was ordained a priest in 2010, in the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe.



As a priest, he first worked in the University Chaplaincy of Madrid, Spain. Then he volunteered for a Mission in Honduras, Central America, where he worked for eight years. In the year 2019 he was sent to Rome to do a three-year course on Biblical Theology. After that he collaborated in a Parish and a Catholic School in the city of Puebla, Mexico. This year he began a pastoral experience in the Diocese of Portsmouth, starting this March in St. Edward's Church, Windsor, and now Bishop Philip appointed him as assistant priest to the parish of St. Peter and the Winchester Martyrs
