# FATHER MARK WRITES: A PLACE FOR ALL

If you've ever stepped into St Peter's during the day, you'll know that the east window is hard to miss. Installed in 1948 as a memorial to those who gave their lives in the Second World War, it draws us into a vision from the Book of Revelation: the "Adoration of the Lamb." Inspired by the Van Eyck masterpiece in Ghent, it's more than glass and colour - it's theology in light.

At the top, God the Father reigns, surrounded by angels. Two swing censers, two hold Alpha and Omega - the first and the last. There are twelve angels here: a number that whispers "completeness." Think of the twelve tribes, the twelve apostles. Beneath, the Holy Spirit hovers as a dove, and on each side a scroll proclaims in Latin:

"These are they which came out of great tribulation, and have washed their robes, and made them white in the blood of the Lamb."

Lower down, in the background are the green slopes of the holy mountain of Zion represented by the Hampshire Downs with wild flowers, some associated with the Virgin Mary. The Lamb of God stands on an altar, His blood flowing into a chalice, encircled by angels. Our Lady is enthroned as Queen of Heaven, canopy held aloft, sceptre in hand, the Book of Revelation open. Around her, saints and prophets, thirty in all, Old Testament prophets and martyrs (including three of the Winchester martyrs) stand around in adoration of the Lamb, representing the great multitude of all nations. At the very base, four figures kneel, representing those who served and sacrificed: Navy, Merchant Navy, Air Force, Army.

Why dwell on this image today? Because this weekend we hear that same passage from Revelation as we celebrate the beautiful Solemnity of All Saints. It's a feast for the countless unnamed saints - ordinary men, women, and children from all over the world who lived extraordinary holiness without fanfare. We honour them not only by remembering but by imitating their lives and seeking their prayers before Christ, the one Mediator.

The Church reminds us: holiness is not for a select few. It's universal. God calls every one of us to live in His love and make that love real for others. That word all matters. Even the word Catholic means "universal." Our faith is not an exclusive club. Heaven - pictured in that east window—is a place for all. Everyone is invited to the Supper of the Lamb.

And here's the wonder: in the Father's house, there's a seat with your name on it. No jostling, no rivalry. In heaven, I don't need to compete. I can rejoice in the gifts others have - even those I lack - and praise God for them. Imagine a table where comparison dies and gratitude lives. That's heaven. And we can taste it now.

How? By resting in our true identity: beloved sons and daughters of God. When that truth sinks in, everything shifts. We belong. We are loved. We don't need to judge or hold contempt. We can forgive, show compassion, pray for healing - even for those who wound us. And we can stop listening to the lies that tell us otherwise.

That number twelve appears again in today's reading:

"I heard the number of those sealed, 144,000" - twelve times twelve times a thousand. And then:

"After this I looked, and behold, a great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb... crying out with a loud voice, 'Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!'

Let us, who have come from all continents of the globe, gather here in our parish to celebrate this wonderful feast and join our voices with theirs as we give praise and worship and honour and blessing to God and the Lamb.

# SECOND COLLECTION - BAMENDA SUNDAY

Each year on the first Sunday of November we celebrate the link between our diocese and the archdiocese of Bamenda in Cameroon. It is a time where we also ask for your financial support to help our brothers and sisters, who are still impacted by the civil unrest that has affected the region since 2016. Despite the risks and challenges the archdiocese continues to run its parishes, provide education and health services, and support thousands of displaced people. Currently, most government services in the region are closed and the only services available are those the archdiocese provides to people of all faiths. During a recent visit to Portsmouth, Archbishop Andrew, Archbishop of Bamenda, acknowledged that our diocese support does not only provide practical benefits to the people of Bamenda but also the encouragement that they are not forgotten in difficult times. - ♣Pray the Eternal Rest prayer: "Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen."
